WHAT IS A BUSHFIRE?

Bushfires are common across the Northern Territory. If you prepare in advance and follow some basic guidelines, more bushfires should not pose a significant threat to you or your property.

You don't have to live in the bush to be threatened by bushfire, you just have to be close enough to be affected by burning material, embers and smoke.

All Territorians should be familiar with the different types of alerts and warnings so you can prepare, act and survive if there is an emergency.

When there's a bushfire in your area, it's your responsibility to take notice, seek information, make decisions and act.

Bushfires are a natural part of the Northern Territory landscape. Fire may threaten people and property with little notice.

There are 2 agencies in the Northern Territory who are responsible for fire management, depending on whether you live in an urban or rural area.

In urban areas, fire management is the responsibility of the NT Fire and Rescue Service.

Bushfires NT supports Territory landholders in fire mitigation and management in rural areas.

PREPARING FOR A BUSHFIRE

Prepare your home and business: know your local bushfire risk and be prepared all year. An unprepared property is not only at risk itself but may also present an increased danger for you, your family and your neighbours.

Prepare your bushfire survival plan: make a plan with your family and ensure everyone knows their role. Your plan should include whether you plan to stay and defend your home or leave early. Practice your bushfire survival plan with the family on a regular basis. Make sure you include a plan for any animals on your property.

Register for bushfire warnings and alerts and tune in: visit Secure NT to register for current bushfire incidents, warnings and Fire Ban notifications. Tune into your local ABC radio or TV station for updates or visit the Bureau of Meteorology website.
